

UNDERSTANDING THE UNIT CODES

Units are offered at one of the following levels:

- Undergraduate Level 1 (unit number coding begins with 1)
- Undergraduate Level 2 (unit number coding begins with 2)
- Undergraduate Level 3 (unit number coding begins with 3)
- Postgraduate Foundational (unit number coding begins with 8)
- Postgraduate Elective (unit number coding begins with 9)

Fields and Disciplines

We structure our learning, teaching and research around four broad Fields of study, each Field housing a range of disciplines. These are listed below, together with the abbreviation for each Field and discipline used in unit codes.

Field A: Humanities

- AL** Biblical Languages
- AL** Languages ancient and modern

Field B: Biblical Studies

- BA** Old Testament
- BN** New Testament
- BS** Biblical Studies

Field C: Christian Thought and History

- CH** Church History
- CT** Systematic Theology

Field D: Theology: Mission and Ministry

- DA** Mission and Ministry
- DM** Missiology
- DP** Pastoral Theology and Ministry Studies
- DS** Spirituality

UNIT CODES

The unit code indicates the discipline and levels of the unit. To explain more fully by means of an example:

BN1/8001S **Interpreting the New Testament**
OR.... BN1001S and BN8001SP

B indicates that the unit is in Field B.

N = New Testament.

1/8 '1' indicates that it is a Level One unit for undergraduates and 8 is a Level 8 for postgraduate studies.

The second, third and fourth figures are the proper numbers for the unit itself.

S indicates that the unit is taught at STC. [Other Colleges are indicated by different letters.]

BA1/8001S **Introducing the Hebrew Bible (classroom)**

BA1/8701S **Introducing the Hebrew Bible (online)**

This unit is offered both in class and online. The second number being the number 7 indicates it is an online class.
